

RG Advanced Judging Course Pre-Course Information

Your preparation prior to attending a course

Prior to attending the course, we expect all candidates will have a broad understanding of the content of the RG Australian Technical Requirements, and the FIG Code of Points specific to our sport at this level.

The course you have enrolled in accredits you to judge at the one of the highest national levels in Australia:

Advanced

The required reading for the course is the **RG FIG Code of Points** <u>and</u> the **RG Australian Levels Program (ALP version 2)**. Before you come to the course it is recommended you meet with an experienced Advanced Silver or Brevet judge to develop an understanding of the content you will be presented with during the course itself.

What to bring with you

Bring your copy of the **RG FIG Code of Points** and the **Australian Levels Program version 2**, making sure you go to the GA website to check whether there are any published errata relevant to the codes.

If at any stage you would like concepts explained further please ask a question. Although throughout the course questions may arise that need further clarification, these will be noted by your presenter and followed up.


The **Advanced** course includes

- a practical exam for both individual and group.

The results from these assessments will be used to determine whether a candidate passes the course. Presenters do not give out results. You will receive an email from the state office to indicate your individual results following an analysis of your assessment scores.
